

Executing Well in the Middle of Uncertain Times

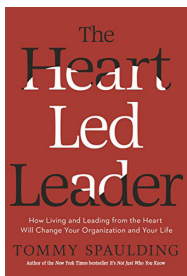

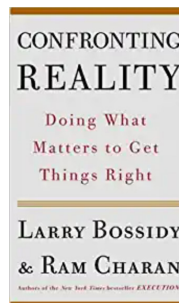
For Deeper Conversation
