Leveraging a learning ecosystem benefits both the individual and the organization by driving performance, productivity, and bottom-line profitability. This approach helps leaders sustain learning and insights over time and positions them to achieve self-actualization, or the state of reaching one's fullest potential. This is important as we endeavor to grow exceptional businesses and become higher-impact leaders to honor God. This is imperative to our achieving not only success, but more importantly, significance in that we are leaving a positive lasting legacy.

As a child, I remember hearing the lyrics of an old spiritual hymn that said, "I believe I'll run on and see what the end will be". It's important to keep growing in life and in business, but you should not run on without God and try to rush the process. Grow with the process.
